[Acts 7.22] But he was also trained by his nurse Jochebed, who was his natural mother, in the ways of God. By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible.' [Hebrews 11.24-27]

There is only God's Word which can give us the hope of life, if we place our faith and trust in Him.
